| Jack                | Yes. The Air France flight coming from Paris.                                  |
| Officer             | I see. Could you tell me how long you'll be staying in the United States, sir? |
| Jack                | Three weeks.   |
| Officer             | Do you have a return ticket?   |
| Jack                | Yes, I do – on 14 July. Would you like to see the ticket?                      |
| Officer             | No, that's OK. <i>Could you tell me</i> what the purpose of your visit is?     |
| Jack                | I'm a student, I'm visiting my host family.                                    |
| Officer             | <i>May I ask</i> where you will stay, sir?                                     |
| Jack                | At their apartment in Manhattan.   |
| Officer             | Will you visit any other cities during your stay?                              |
| Jack                | Yes, we will probably travel a bit. I'd like to see Washington DC.             |
| Officer             | OK. Thank you, Mr. Wilson. Enjoy your stay.                                    |
