


Shakespeare's life and poems

Stratford-upon-Avon is set in a beautiful rural Warwickshire countryside. 1

William Shakespeare, the most famous writer in the English language, was born on 23 April 1564 and he died on the same day in 1616.

He was a poet, playwright and actor for most of his life. He wrote 37 plays and 154 sonnets or short poems.

Shakespeare is most famous for his plays, including *Romeo and Juliet*, *Macbeth*, and *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. 2

The word 'sonnet' refers to the form of the poem which has a special rhythm and rhyme. Shakespeare's 154 sonnets were published in a book in 1609. The poems are about many topics including love, beauty and death. 3

Shakespeare married Anne Hathaway in 1582 and the couple had three children. By 1592 Shakespeare was in London, writing plays and probably performing in them too in the Globe Theatre. 4

Shakespeare retired in 1613 and came back to Stratford from London. 5

Shakespeare's plays are performed all over the world and in almost every language.


A) However, his poems were also very popular. Shakespeare wrote a special type of poem, called sonnets.

E) They are often read together in groups of poems on a similar theme, called for example the *Dark Lady* and *Fair Youth*.


