

SOME, ANY, NO et leurs composés

Comment traduire **DU** (pain), **DE LA** (viande), **DES** (frites)?
Grâce à **SOME, ANY** ou **NO** ! Mais attention à leurs emplois !

> **SOME**: dans les phrases affirmatives

Exemple: I have some friends.

> **ANY**: dans les phrases négatives ou les questions

Exemple: Do you have any cheese? - He doesn't have any friends in Chicago.

EXCEPTION! "some" est utilisée dans les questions quand on propose ou quand on demande quelque chose dont on est sûr que la réponse sera positive.

Exemples: Would you like some bread? (*proposition polie*) - Could I have some water? (*demande polie, on ne s'attend pas à ce que la personne en face réponde: non! :-)*)

> **NO**: pour indiquer une négation, une absence de quelque chose:

I have no friends. *Je n'ai pas d'amis.* *There's no butter left in the fridge.*

LES PRINCIPAUX COMPOSÉS :

> **SOMEBODY, SOMEWHERE, SOMETHING**: dans les phrases affirmatives (règle qui s'applique à **SOME**). Quelqu'un, quelque part, quelque chose.

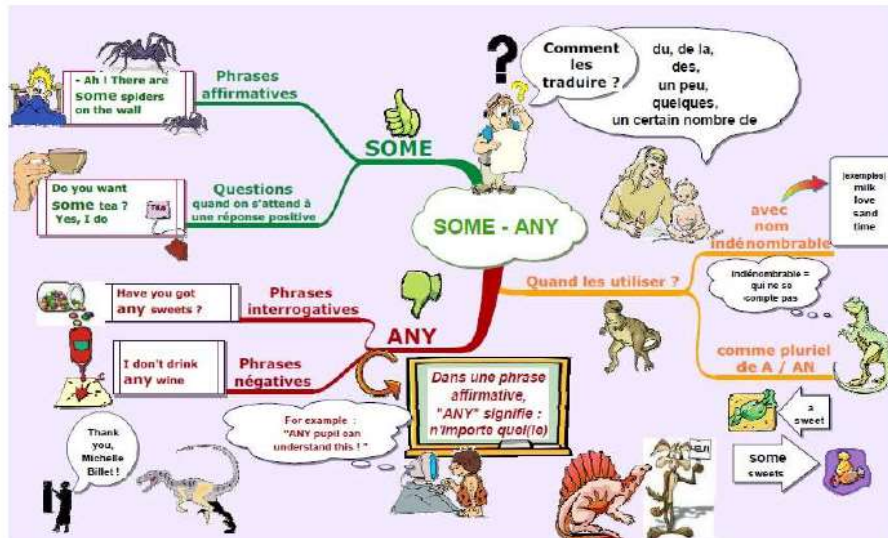
Exemple: He lives somewhere near here.

> **ANYBODY, ANYWHERE, ANYTHING**: Même sens, mais en suivant la règle qui s'applique à **ANY**

Exemples: Do you know anything about that boy? - She doesn't have anywhere to go.

> **NOTHING**: rien

Exemple: This show is very boring! There's nothing interesting tonight on TV!



1) Compléter avec A / AN, SOME ou ANY:

- I've got cookbook.
- There iswater in the fridge.
- There isn'twater left in the bottle.
- There was.....bottle of soda on the shelf.
- She wants to eatapple.
- Have we gotchips?

2) Compléter avec SOMETHING, ANYTHING ou NOTHING:

- He's hungry, but there's to eat in the fridge!
- I don't want to eat.....
- I can see under the table. What is it?
- "Pardon? What did you say?" - "....."
- Is there interesting to watch on TV tonight?

3) Compléter avec SOME ANY NO et leurs dérivés

- They haven't gotidea where to go for their holidays.
- He hastime to watch TV tonight; he's got too much work to do.
- Question : - Did you speak to
Answer : - No, I spoke to
- I'm thirsty, I'd like tea, please.
- There's I don't understand, could you explain it to me, please?
- This homeless man is very poor, he's got money.
- 'Did you hear that noise?' 'No, I didn't hear
- 'Did you buyfruit, this morning?'
'Yes, I boughtoranges. Do you want one?'
- 'Did you go to the cinema last night?'
'No, I went : I stayed at home and studied with Anglais Facile.'
- There'sat the door who says he wants to speak to you.
