The coronation of Charles III and his wife, Camilla, as king and queen of the United Kingdom and the other Commonwealth realms took place on Saturday, 6th May 2023, at Westminster Abbey. Charles acceded to the throne on 8 September 2022, upon the death of his mother, Elizabeth II.

Compared with previous

10 coronations, the ceremony underwent some alterations to represent multiple faiths, cultures, and communities across the United Kingdom, and was shorter than his mother's coronation in 1953. The

15 ceremony began with the anointing of



Charles, symbolising his spiritual entry into kingship, and then his crowning and enthronement, representing his assumption of temporal powers and responsibilities. Camilla was crowned in a shorter and simpler ceremony. The royal family then travelled to Buckingham Palace, in a state procession, and appeared on the balcony to celebrate the occasion.

In addition to the coronation ceremony, the event was marked by public ceremonies and celebrations in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, and the British Crown Dependencies and overseas territories. On 7th May, the Coronation Big Lunch took place in the United Kingdom, providing the public with the opportunity to mark the occasion with street parties. Also, a Coronation Concert was held on the same day at Windsor Castle with representatives of the King and Queen's charities as well as members of the general public in attendance. The Big Help Out initiative took place on 8th May, to encourage community service and volunteering. Both the coronation at Westminster Abbey and the concert at Windsor Castle were broadcast on television and streamed online.

This marked the first coronation of a British monarch in the 21st century and the 40th to be held at Westminster Abbey since 1066.

The ceremony took place at Westminster Abbey in London (I. 6)

- 2. How was ceremony different from previous coronations?
- ... The ceremony was different as it "represented multiple faiths, cultures, and communities across the United Kingdom, and was shorter than Charles' mother's coronation in 1953". (l. 10-14)
- 3. What did the royal family do after Charles III and Camilla's coronations?

 After the coronations, the royal family "travelled to Buckingham Palace, in a state procession and appeared on the balcony to celebrate the occasion".
