2. What else do we learn about him?

He runs an extreme holiday company for blind and sighted travelers.

He has a good sense of humor.

He says blind people can do *more* adventurous things *than* sighted people.

He explains that when he offers a group the opportunity to skydive.

He describes himself as "the blind guy who wants to show you the world"

However, he doesn't tell us about his family.

Present simple → vérité Générale, habitude, choses constantes, habituelles. Ne pas oublier le "s" à la 3ème personne du singulier.

3. One day, he organized a trip to Cuba.

A few years ago, he took a group of people (blind people and sighted guides) on a trip to Cuba. He offer<u>ed</u> them the opportunity to skydive.

The sighted folks <u>did not</u> want to get involved because they were more afraid than the blind travelers.

It was an amazing feeling for him. He felt free. He could feel the elements bombarding him from every side. He realized he was up here, miles above the ground.

Past simple -> événement passé, daté. On utilise le SIMPLE PAST
