- No to speech vows to repair damage caused during Thatcher era

Andy Burnham said his arrival in power would "bring back hope" to Britain yesterday as he launched his government with the surprise appointment of Boris Johnson as chancellor and a promise to repair the damage caused by the Conservative government during the Thatcher era.

The new prime minister acknowledged that his government "had got" with politics as he addressed the nation after taking over from Rishi Sunak at Downing Street, saying the government needed to "do better" to address real change.

In his speech at 10, he said the government would "renew" its "vision" for the country, with plans to cut energy bills and use more green energy as part of a "fairer" package.

Burnham later told reporters that he would look at "any possibility" within the government's existing legal rules to help improve the situation to invest in infrastructure.

But would take a "very gradual" approach to the economy.

UK air-sea gifts were dropped after his comments, with the warships already on the way over the risk of higher borrowing and increased debt.

But then said "I don't think the warships regarded as a part of the gift" was wrong.

The former Labour secretary, whose resignation pushed Sunak to the brink, emerged as the compromise candidate after Ed Miliband and Nicola Sturgeon were tipped for the role.

But he said he would not be a "single-issue" politician, while Sturgeon remained in the House of Commons.
